It is really important that the pupils at Great Dunham Primary School have participated in The Big Ambition survey and had their say.

I want to ensure that the voices of the children in Norfolk are fairly represented in the findings so that I can share their views with the most senior members of the country.

I must reiterate that it is vital that all children have their voice heard through this survey because, as Children's Commissioner for England, I have a statutory duty to protect and promote the views and interests of children. The Big Ambition provides a much-needed opportunity for the children of England to tell political decision makers what is important to them ahead of the General Election. I will be sharing their responses with Government to ensure that children's voices are heard.

Please share the survey and resources with teachers in your school and encourage them to use it in their lessons. Children can complete the survey in assemblies, form times, PSHE or in other lessons this term. The survey can also be done as homework and parents can assist children who cannot complete the survey themselves (children under 5 and children with Special Educational Needs). This is a great opportunity to teach children about politics and why it is important for them to use their voice!"

#### Ranworth Class

In Ranworth, this week we have been putting more of our focus onto our project about The Romans! We have started creating our own fact files about the changes that happened when they invaded the United Kingdom, focusing on Hadrian's Wall again and beginning our wonderful creation of a miniature replica of it! We have finished our Science unit about sound, the children have been superstars and have reflected on their new knowledge by using quizzes (mainly to outscore one another!) and showcase just how far they have come.

#### Hickling Class

This week, Hickling enjoyed a wonderful day out by going back to the 1940s to experience life in World War 2 at Gressenhall. The children were able to carry out jobs as part of the land army, learn about being in the home guard and got the opportunity to go into the shop to purchase rations. It was a real pleasure to take the class and they were a credit to themselves and the school. Thank you to Mrs Rogers, Mrs Allen and Mr Allen who volunteered to come and enjoy the day with us.

The week has also seen the children find out about different countries in our 'World Day'. The children learnt some new phrases in different languages, tried some new foods, located the country on a map, and completed arty activities connected with the country.

In the classroom, the children have been working hard on creating their own narrative based on our original text. They are using their imagination well. In maths, we are starting to use division and multiplication to find fractions of numbers.







### Reminders

Parking outside the school; Please do not park on the yellow lines outside of school or in the car park.

**Snack**; Please only pack fresh fruit or vegetables in your child's bag for their break time snack.

**Breakfast and After School Club;** If your child is attending either breakfast or after school club please can you email the office each Monday and let Mrs Marshall know which dates your child would like to attend and if possible, for after school club when you plan to collect your child.

**Name ALL uniform;** Please remember to write your child's name in all their school uniform and PE kit, this helps staff to reunite lost clothing with your child.

**Office Hours;** The office is open 8:30am – 3:30pm please leave a message on the answer phone outside of these hours.

**Registers;** The school gate opens at 8:40am and closes at 8:45am. Registers in class are taken at 8;45am. If you arrive after 8:45am you will need to buzz the office and your child will be marked as late with the number of minutes recorded. The registers close at 8:55am arrival at 8:55am or after will be recorded as an unauthorised absence and will affect your child's attendance.

Holidays; Holiday taken during term time will not be authorised and may results in a Fixed Penalty Notice of £60 being issued per child, per parent. So for a family of four that could mean a fine of £240.00.

Wellies and Waterproofs; If possible please can all the children have wellies and waterproofs in school for outdoor learning. Their wellies and waterproofs can stay in school. Please can you name your child's wellies and waterproofs.

**Chewing gum and cough sweets;** Chewing gun is NOT allowed in school. If your child needs cough/throat lozenge in school then these must be brought to the office in the morning so they are supervised when eating them and not shared with other children.
