Ranworth Class

This week in Ranworth we have been working on understanding the different states of matter, whether objects are solids, liquids or gas. We have even worked down to a molecular level and understood that everything is made of matter and it's how that matter is built up that tells us what state it is in! We have been looking into major events around the world and have had the opportunity to learn about some of the key ones that are notable for most people. Some of these were the football World Cup, the Olympics, MLK day and more! The children have also been able to research and find out about major events in things that they are interested in too, displaying them in creative and wonderful ways.

We have been learning about volcanoes for our project work and have been drawing volcanos and looking at what makes them erupt. We have been watching the volcano in Iceland and have enjoyed watching the lava flows.

Reminders

The registers close at 8:55am arrival at 8:55am or after will be recorded as an unauthorised absence and will affect your child's attendance.

Holidays; Holiday taken during term time will not be authorised and may results in a Fixed Penalty Notice of £60 being issued per child, per parent. So, for a family of four that could mean a fine of £240.00.

Wellies and Waterproofs; If possible please can all the children have wellies and waterproofs in school for outdoor learning. Their wellies and waterproofs can stay in school. Please can you name your child's wellies and waterproofs. Oulton Class Wednesday afternoon. Ranworth Class Tuesday afternoon. Hickling class Thursday afternoon.

Chewing gum and cough sweets; Chewing gum is NOT allowed in school. If your child needs cough/throat lozenge in school then these must be brought to the office in the morning so they are supervised when eating them and not shared with other children.
